Merrimack College's Center for the Study of Jewish-Christian-Muslim Relations announces the **Goldziher Prize**, for scholarship which contributes significantly to understanding, reverence and common moral purpose between Jews and Muslims. The prize, a \$25,000.00 cash award, made possible by a generous grant from The William & Mary Greve Foundation, is named for the great 19th-century Jewish Islamicist, Ignác Goldziher, "who came to be recognized as Europe's greatest scholar of Islam" (Suzannah Heschel), and "one of the profoundest and most original scholars in Europe..." (Journal of the American Oriental Society).

Nominations, including self-nomination, accepted until October 1, 2009^{CE}. Nomination should include reasons for nomination and specifically cite work or works of scholarship.
